

Lesson: World Music Drumming

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Level: Beginner/Intermediate

Resources: Studio One DAW, optional MIDI controller

Objectives: Students will demonstrate understanding of world musical style through composition using MIDI instruments.

Procedure:

- 1. Select and discuss the principles of rhythm of a world music drumming style, using appropriate listening examples (Ex. Latin American music).
- 2. Create a new song in Studio One and select "Instruments" in the browse menu. Select a drum kit (Ex. Brazilian kit) from the "Presence" folder and drag and drop to create a track.
- 3. Quantize to eighth, or sixteenth notes, depending on student level.
- 4. If using manual MIDI entry, double-click the track and create a region.
- 5. Select a single sound and either enter the MIDI data in the edit menu or play the rhythm using a MIDI keyboard. (Ex. Clave E4 and play a son clave pattern)
- 6. Layer a second sound such as a conga pattern. Repeat until all sounds are added. This could also be done in groups with each student responsible for a single rhythm.
- 7. Create a loop to repeat the beat, or copy and paste for the desired length.
- 8. Share the final project with the class, having students discuss the significance of the rhythm as it applies to the selected culture.
- 9. Save the beat as a Musicloop in a shared student folder for later use.
